Officiant Grace to you and peace from God our Father and from the Lord

Jesus Christ. *Philippians 1:2*

INVITATORY (sung)

Musician Lord, open our lips.

All: And our mouth shall proclaim your praise.*

Musician Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,

As it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

VENITE: PSALM 95:1-7 (Sung responsively by whole verse)

Musician Come let us sing to the Lord;*

let us shout for joy to the Rock of our salvation.

All Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving*

and raise a loud shout to him with psalms.

Musician For the Lord is a great God,*

and a great King above all gods.

All In his hand are the caverns of the earth,*

and the heights of the hills are his also.

Musician The sea is his, for he made it,*

and his hands have molded the dry land.

All Come, let us bow down, and bend the knee,*

and kneel before the Lord our Maker.

Musician For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture and the sheep of

his hand.*

PSALM 30 (said responsively by whole verse)

Musician I will exalt you, LORD,

for you lifted me out of the depths

you spared me from going down to the pit.

All Sing the praises of the LORD, you his faithful people;

praise his holy name.

but his favor lasts a lifetime; weeping may stay for the night,

but rejoicing comes in the morning.

All When I felt secure, I said,

"I will never be shaken."

Musician LORD, when you favored me,

All To you, LORD, I called;

to the Lord I cried for mercy:

Musician "What is gained if I am silenced,

THE LESSON Hebrews 4:14-16

THE GOSPEL Matthew 6:25-34

Officiant The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Matthew All Glory to you, Lord Christ.

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life^[e]?

"And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.
